APPENDIX B**Student Suspensions Since the Beginning of the 1972-73 School Year as Reported to Staff of the Children's Defense Fund**

As part of an extensive survey of children out of school in 17 school districts throughout the country, the Children's Defense Fund of the Washington Research Project, Inc. attempted to determine the extent to which suspensions were a common method of discipline employed by the schools in those districts. Indeed, the study showed that 4.4 percent of all school-age children surveyed were suspended and 7.9 percent of all secondary school-age children surveyed were suspended. In 11 of the 30 areas surveyed, over 10 percent of the secondary school-age children were suspended. Over 15 percent of the secondary school-age children were suspended in four of the areas. In addition, monitors found that 24 percent of the children suspended at least once were, in fact, suspended three or more times.

This information was gathered using a uniform questionnaire which included questions about the number of children who had been suspended, the frequency and duration of the suspensions, the reasons for the suspensions, and the procedures—regarding notification, hearing, and readmittance—which accompanied the disciplinary actions. Staff monitors visited more than 8,000 households in nine states and the District of Columbia—specifically, parts of Autauga County and Montgomery, Alabama; Denver, Colorado; Hancock County and Macon, Georgia; Davenport, Iowa; Floyd County, Kentucky; Portland, Maine; Cambridge, Holyoke, New Bedford, Somerville and Springfield, Massachusetts; Canton, Mississippi; Columbia and Sumter County, South Carolina; and Washington, D.C.

The areas surveyed—census tracts and housing projects in urban areas, and parts of rural counties—were selected on the basis of specific census measures including racial and ethnic population, income, family size, and number of children under 18 years old and on the basis of information

gathered from community contacts. In an effort to cover more households than the Census Bureau did in the 15 percent sample through which it gathered information on children not enrolled in school, Children's Defense Fund staff members visited at least every fourth household. Interviewing in these areas took place between July 1973 and March 1974.

There are three tables which follow: Table I shows, for each area surveyed, the number and percent of school-age children by age level, suspended from school at least once since the beginning of the 1972-73 school year and the total number of suspensions involved. Since 90 percent of the children suspended at least once were secondary school-age students, Tables II and III describe, for each area surveyed where more than three percent of the 12-17 year-olds were suspended, the number of times these students were suspended (Table II) and the durations of these suspensions (Table III). The raw data from which these tables were prepared is available at the Washington Office of the Children's Defense Fund, 1763 R Street, N.W., Washington, D.C.
